Tribute to Steve Jobs. Think different.

Steve Jobs. Co-founder of Apple inc. Developer of iMac, iPod, iPhone and iPad. Died in 2011 at the age of 55.

Speaker:

“Here is to the crazy ones, the misfits, the rebels, the trouble makers, the round pegs and the square holes, the ones who see things differently. They are not fond of rules, and they have no **1. respect** for the status quo. You can quote them, disagree with them, glorify or vilify them, but the only thing you can't do is ignore them because they **2. change** things, they push the human race forward. While some may see them as the crazy ones, we see genius because the **3. people** who are crazy enough to think they can change the world are the ones who do.”

Steve Jobs:



*“Sometimes, life is going to hit you on the head with a brick. Don't lose faith. I'm convinced that the only thing that kept me going was that I loved what I **4. did**. You've got to find what you love, and that is as true for work as it is for your lovers. Your work is going to fill a **5. large** part of your life, and the only way to be truly satisfied is to do what you believe is great work. And the only way to do great work is to **6. love** what you do. If you haven't found it yet, keep looking and don't settle. As with all matters of the **7. heart**, you will know when you find it, and, like any great relationship, it just gets better and better as the years roll on. So keep looking, don't settle...”*

*“And yet, death is the destination we all share. No one's ever escaped it. When I was 17, I read a quote that went something like, ‘If you live **8. each** day as if it was your last, some day you will **most certainly be right**.’ And since then, for the past 33 years, I've looked in the mirror every **9. morning** and asked myself, ‘If today were the last day of my life, would I want to do what I am about to do today?’ And whenever the answer's been no for too many days in a row, I know I need to change something. Remembering that I'll be dead soon is the most important tool I've ever encountered to help me **10. make** the big choices in life.”*
